tics for heirlooms, dust them off, and trek them downtown for ruthless
evaluation by teams of antique experts. Occasionally the owners are sur-
prised to learn they have been harboring priceless artifacts: a Tiffany bowl
used to catch the car keys, a Van Gogh in the downstairs bathroom. What
they lugged downtown in a paper bag, they carry home in bubble wrap and
receiving blankets.
