Wednesday, May 20, Knights of Columbus meeting. Dinner at 6:00, Rosary at 6:45, and meeting at 7:00 PM.

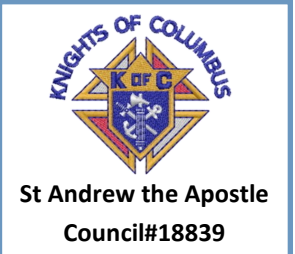
Monday, May 25, the office will be closed for Memorial Day.

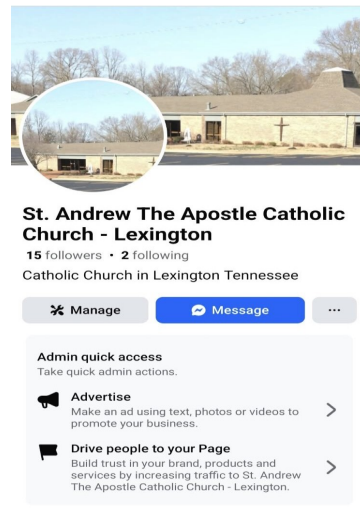

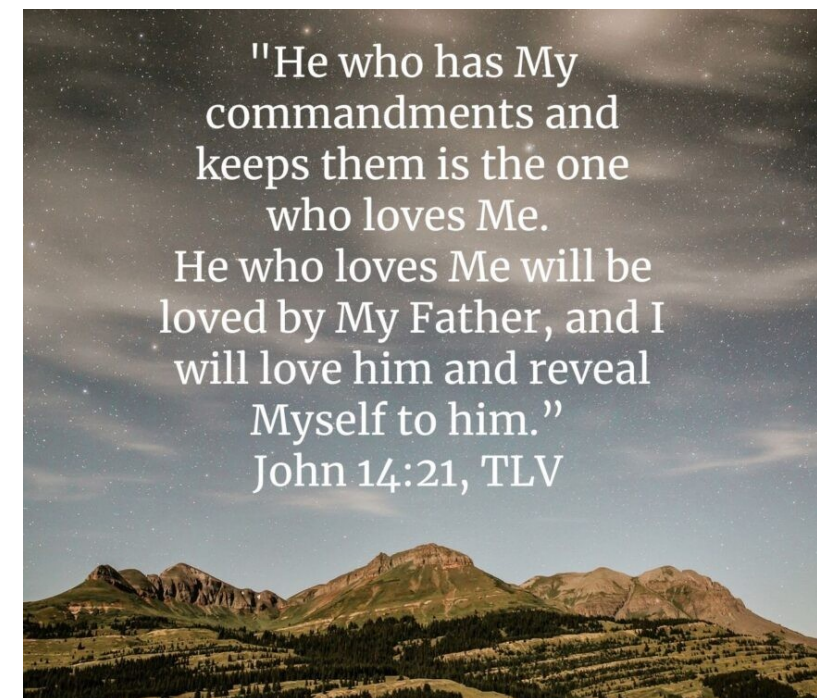
